

My choir is going on a European tour next year but if I'm not still a treble I won't be able to go. I'm twelve now.

You sent me:

A recording of yourself singing a treble solo, your exact age and your height and weight.

I said:

Going by your height and weight, your voice is very likely already a long way through change.

I asked you:

To do some test recordings for me of speaking, singing and various vocal exercises, and to do some more tests with electrodes fixed to your neck.

Your choir director said:

We don't think this boy's voice will last beyond Christmas.

What happened

Your treble voice lasted all year and you were able to go on the tour as the last thing you did in your choir.

My verdict: By the time you contacted me, your voice had almost finished changing. We discovered that you actually had two voices – a baritone voice you didn't use and a treble voice that you were producing in falsetto. That voice lasted another nine months.
